Language Camps for Kids (11–14 years) on Lake Constance

Learn languages and enjoy your holiday – that’s what our language camps on Lake Constance offer. The Carl Duisberg Centers combine language instruction with exciting leisure activities to provide you with a varied holiday program.

In the language camps with a focus on Football or Activity Camp, participants learn English or German in the morning and get moving in the afternoon when they enjoy sports and other activities.

After language lessons in the morning, the summer camps become international! All the kids from the German and English camps come together for the recreational program, which lends our summer camps a unique international flair.

Our experienced teachers and counselors interact with the kids as much as possible in the target language. This gives the children the opportunity to directly apply and expand their newly acquired language skills. Thanks to the vibrant and varied camp life, the kids also have the chance to improve social skills and develop team spirit while working and playing together.

Language instruction

From Monday through Friday, the children receive German or English lessons tailored to their current level in groups of no more than 15. The children should have studied the target language for at least one year in school or have completed/finished the A1 level. Our lessons focus on having fun with the language and seek to give the children the confidence to actively use the foreign language. Our experienced teachers show the kids how fun learning a language can be and there’s never a dull moment. We use modern, age-appropriate teaching materials and methods. The language skills learned in the morning are directly applied

in the afternoon in a casual, informal atmosphere. In addition to improving their language skills, the participants will also expand their intercultural competence. Before the start of camp, we kindly ask the kids to complete a short (online) placement test. On the last day of camp, all the children will receive a certificate of participation.

Meals and accommodation

The camps take place at the youth education center in Ludwigshafen on Lake Constance. The center’s charming building with its large garden offers numerous recreational activities and is just a stone’s throw away from Lake Constance. The train station is also in the immediate vicinity, which means that the participants and their counselors can easily tour the surrounding area. The boys and girls are housed separately in multi-bed dormitories. Bed linen is provided. The counselors are available to assist the children around the clock and accompany them to all activities. The youth center has its own football field as well as a volleyball court. Should the weather be less than ideal, the center has a ping pong table and table football indoors. Sitting cozy in front of the wood-burning fireplace, you can enjoy a glorious view of Lake Constance. All meals will be eaten at the youth center. The children start the day with a hearty breakfast and enjoy a freshly cooked warm meal for lunch after class. After the afternoon activities, the children return to the youth center to eat. As a rule, the evening program takes place in and around the youth center. For children who attend our language camp for two or more weeks, we offer half board on weekends.

Recreational program

The activity program (Activity Camp or Football) is suitable for beginners as well as budding professionals. After dinner, the participants can still enjoy activities near the camp accommodations. For children who book two or more weeks, we offer a full-day excursion on Saturdays. Depending on the weather, we will adjust the afternoon activity for the football camp if necessary.

Daily Routine

The daily routine for all camp participants of the Activity and Football Camp are the same. Only the leisure program in the afternoon differs depending on the language camp booked. In the evening, everyone meets again and enjoys an evening activity together.

FOOTBALL CAMP



Football training with experienced coaches is held every afternoon for 2 hours at the club FC Ludwighafen's facilities. The techniques are taught and conveyed using an extremely practically oriented methodology.
